THE GUARDING!

General Information

- 1. We recommend you read this manual thoroughly before operating the machinery, in order that you will be fully conversant with the use of the machine, especially in areas which might cause danger.
- 2. Pay particular attention on how to stop the tractor in case of emergency.
- 3. Pass on all safety comments and notices to other users.
- 4. **Never** let the blade shafts rotate when the entire length of machine does not rest on the ground.
- 5. The exhaust fumes from tractors contain carbon monoxide, a scentless yet deadly gas. Therefore the tractor engine should not be run in an enclosed area.
- 6. The signs and decals on the machine indicate important information for safe operation follow this information for your OWN safety.
- 7. Always use ear protection where the noise level is higher than 85 dB(A) however this is not applicable when driving on a main road.
- 8. Due to the machine having rotating parts, operators should wear close fitting clothes.
- 9. When operating on roads, ensure you follow the applicable traffic rules.
- 10. Only qualified drivers with suitable experience should operate tractors especially when coupled to the machinery.

- 11. When transporting the machine on roads, adhere to the maximum permissible transport dimensions. If the machine width is greater than 2.55m and smaller than 3.5m then ensure maximum road speed is 12mph.
- 12. If applicable, attach light screens and/or warning signs.
- 13. If applicable, put the machine into its transport position subsequent to travelling on the roads.
- 14. Once a machine is raised on the 3 point linkage for transport, ensure that the lever is locked against lowering!
- 15. Before operating the machine, complete safety checks on both the tractor and the machine.
- 16. Never take passengers on the tractor or the mower.
- 17. If required, fit front weights in accordance with the tractor manufacturers mounting instructions.
- 18. All cables, hoses, etc. for rams, lighting, etc. should be fitted in such a way that during all working conditions they cannot be damaged, cause unexpected movements or interrupt they function.
- 19. Pay particular attention at curves and corners considering the large width of the machine as it increases the turning circle of the tractor. Also be aware of the extra inertia created by the weight of the machine.
- 20. Adapt speed of operation to conditions of the yard and workplace.
- 21. Working with tractors on slopes is very dangerous! However if work on slopes cannot be avoided then care must be taken and avoid sudden movement.
- 22. Only work during daylight or with good artificial light.
- 23. Prior to starting work, remove all objects from the workplace which might be caught and thrown by the machine.
- 24. If applicable, ensure that the jack or support wheel is in its lowest position when the machine is to be attached or unattached.

Information particular to the rotary machines

- 25. Before use, tighten the blades' nut, which has a left hand thread with the spanner provided.
- 26. To prevent damage, ensure the machine is fitted to the 3 point linkage correctly.
- 27. When the machine is in a non working or transport position the PTO must be disconnected and the rotary blades must have stopped spinning.
- 28. Prior to starting repairs and maintenance the following precautionary steps must be taken
 - switch off the PTO
 - wait for the blades to stop spinning
 - switch off tractor and remove key
- 29. After the machine hits an object, stop and check for damage. If damage has occurred then the machine must be repaired prior to recommencing work.
- 30. Only use the machine when it is complete and all guards are in good condition.
- 31. Be careful during the connection and disconnection of the machine to the tractor.
- 32. Never stand on the machine whilst it is in operation **ESPECIALLY** on machines with a wooden deck.

Operating Instructions

33. Prior to initial use

Grease both joints on PTO shaft and all bearings on machine Check gearbox oil level Use spanner provided to tighten left hand nuts securing blades

34. After initial 10 acres work (sooner if work is heavier i.e. scrub, set aside etc.)

Check belt tension (para 38) Check tightness of all nuts, especially blade left hand nuts

35. Mounting onto tractor

The machine is designed to fit quickly and easily onto Cat 1 or 2 tractor linkage (it can be easily modified to fit Cat 3) by means of the link arms being fixed to the bar through the U frame (2000200), (however extra care needs to be taken where tractors have small wheels or a low PTO). The tractor top link is then connected the linkage (2000205). Adjust the top link so that the wire cable (61191) is slack when the machine is flat on the ground.

Check chains or stabiliser bar must be adjusted correctly to prevent the machine from slopping from side to side.

NOTE!

Before lifting the machine ensure the stop on the hydraulics is set to prevent the PTO from hitting the linkage and frame thus preventing bending.

36. Starting

Start the machine with it slightly raised, out of the working area, by selecting 540 for PTO speed and engaging the drive.

ATTENTION!

Damage may occur if the machine is started when fully on the ground.

37. Cutting height adjustment

After setting the skids, ensuring they are level both sides, run the machine to confirm height of cut. To adjust height, simply undo the 4 nuts & bolts holding each skid and reposition in new hole, either on skid adjuster or on machine frame.

38. Adjustment of V belts


The V-belts are tightened at the driven V-belt pulleys by removing one or more adjusting plates (a) and fitting them on top of the pulley (c).

To this end, proceed as follows:

- Remove the four nuts (32004) on the V-belt pulley (32011).
- Remove the V-belt from the adjusting plates (32010).
- Remove one or more adjusting plates (depending on the degree of belt slackness).
- Fit the V-belt again around the remaining adjusting plates. In doing so, be careful not to pinch your fingers!
- Fit the upper pulley half with the nuts. Note: <u>Tighten the nuts only at the point indicated by D on the drawing below</u>. For the other nuts, rotate the pulley each time a quarter turn.
- Then check the V-belt tension and repeat the above if necessary.



Check the V-belt tension after the first running hour and re-tighten if necessary. The tension is subsequently to be checked at regular intervals.



39. Fitting a new belt


To fit a new belt, loosen 2 nuts (2000164) to allow belt change doors to move (2000160 & 2000161). If you are replacing a lower belt, it is advisable to remove the upper belt to allow easier access to that below. Once the doors are open, feed the belt over the blade and up into the main channel. Thread belt over whole unit. Ensure there are at least 5 shims in the outer pulley system to enable future adjustment (see above).

40. Adjusting the tapered bearings

Slacken the countersunk screw (2000319) (A) which secures the threaded adjusting ring (2000318) (C) into the bearing housing (2000310). Unscrew the adjusting ring (left hand thread) to reveal the tapered bearings. After fitting new bearings take care not to over tighten the adjusting ring which could overload the bearings.

Do not fit a new race without a new ring as the taper angle may vary.



41. Fitting new shear bolt

As the machine design protects the gearbox and tractor by means of a shear bolt system contained within the main drive boss, there may be occasions where this needs replacing (e.g. after hitting an obstacle).

If the pin is not broken, remove blade by means of left hand nut (see instructions for blade removal below).

Remove boss (2000300) from main drive casting (61702) by releasing 6 x 6 mm Allen screws (60384) taking care not to damage screw heads. Remove old shear bolt (2000301) and insert new item with dowel (2000302). Refit boss, ensuring it is secured tightly to drive casting.

NOTE! THIS IS A DESIGN FEATURE OF THE MACHINE AND SO THERE IS NO WARRANTY ON THE STUB SHEAR BOLT (PART – 2000301)

PTO Drive shaft

- 42. Only use the PTO shaft supplied by the manufacturer.
- 43. The guards on the PTO shaft, machine and tractor must always be in good condition.
- 44. Ensure that the prescribed shaft overlap of the PTO (as shown in the PTO manufacturer's instructions) occurs in both transport and working positions.
- 45. Only connect the PTO shaft to the tractor and machine when the tractor PTO is disconnected and the tractor is switched off.
- 46. Prior to using the machine, ensure that the PTO shaft is correctly fitted and locked in place.
- 47. To ensure the PTO shaft does not spin, use the locking chains to secure the shaft to both the machine and tractor in the places provided.
- 48. Before engaging the PTO, ensure the speed and direction of rotation of the shaft are in accordance with the machine. These details are shown on the machine by means of a sign.
- 49. <u>Do not exceed</u> the indicated PTO speed.
- 50. Never engage the PTO shaft when the tractor engine is off.
- 51. Keep a safe distance away from the PTO shaft when it is engaged.
- 52. Place the disconnected shaft on the attachment points provided on the machine.
- 53. As soon as the PTO shaft has been disconnected, attach the guard bush onto the tractor's PTO.

Maintenance and inspection

DANGER!

MAINTENANCE AND INSPECTION ON THE BOTTOM OF THE MACHINE MUST NEVER BE PERFORMED WHEN THE MACHINE IS ONLY CARRIED BY THE TRACTOR'S HYDRAULICS AND 3 POINT LINKAGE.
ALWAYS ENSURE THE MACHINE IS SUPPORTED AND TAKE SPECIAL PRECAUTIONS AGAINST UNEXPECTED FALLING OF THE MACHINE (e.g. USE A BLOCK & TACKLE WITH A MINIMAL WEIGHT CAPACITY OF THE MACHINE AS INDICATED ON THE STAMP ON THE MACHINE).

ATTENTION!

VIBRATION DURING OPERATION IS MOSTLY CAUSED BY THE IMBALANCE OF BADLY WORN BLADES. THIS VIBRATION CAN CAUSE SERIOUS DAMAGE TO THE MACHINE SO IF VIBRATION IS NOTICED DURING OPERATION OR A CHANGE IN THE NOISE OF THE MACHINE, STOP IMMEDIATELY, INSPECT THE MACHINE FOR DAMAGE AND REPAIR THE FAULT BEFORE RESTARTING.

54. Gearbox.


The oil content required for the gearbox is 0.751 of Hypoid 90 oil. The gearbox oil is to be changed after the first 40 running hours and subsequently once a year. The oil is to be changes as follows:

- Clean the drain and fill plugs and surrounding area.
- Remove the PTO shaft.
- Put the mower vertically backwards.



To this end use a tackle or fork-lift truck having a minimum lifting capacity exceeding or equal to the weight of the mower. Take precautions to prevent the mower from dropping or falling over during the work!

- · Remove drain plug A and collect the oil.
- Put the mower back into its horizontal position.
- Remove bleed nipple B and fill the box with 0.75l of oil. The oil should reach exactly the level of the drain plug.
- Fit both plugs.





55. Greasing Points.

The pictures below show the greasing points to be lubricated daily with multipurpose lithium grease (under very heavy conditions, even several times a day to press any penetrated foreign matter back to the outside).

Greasing points: A. Bearing houses

B. Ground roller (if provided)





56. Winter storage.

In the event the machine is put out of service for an extended period of time, it will be necessary to perform an intensive cleaning. Thereupon, lubricate all greasing points and change the gearbox oil. After this, have the machine run for a few minutes.


57. Blade Maintenance.

Check from time to time the condition of the cutting blades. If the cutting result isn't good, the blades must be ground or, if necessary, replaced.

Note: When removing the blades, bear in mind that the fixing nut has a left-handed screw thread!

When grinding, remember the following (see diagram below):


- The cutting edge of the blade has an angle of 30°.
- The blade corner (B) must be square. A rounded corner reduces the cutting effect.
- Grind each end of both blades in the same way so that they will not be out of balance.



If your machine has swinging blades, regularly check the condition of the blade holders, blade bushes and bolt connections.



Never work with a mower whose blade holders, bolt connections, blades or blade bushes do not have the minimum dimensions required! (See below).



- 58. All guards must be checked before operating and must be replaced if found faulty or defective.
- 59. Prior to use, the wooden deck (if applicable) must be inspected for signs of wear and damage. If in doubt, any area should be replaced immediately.
- 60. If the machine has a wooden deck, this must be cleaned down at the end of every season and treated with a good quality wood preservative.
- 61. Ensure all maintenance is carried out using proper tools.

- 1. All instructions outlined in this manual have been carried out.
- 2. All maintenance has been correctly carried out.

- 5. All safety precautions have been adhered to.


When you require a spare part for your machine please order a genuine Votex component via your main Votex dealer or by contacting us direct.

After each diagram is a parts list relating to each page, which gives the Votex part number AND description.


If you are unsure of a part then we suggest you send the original to us or take it to your dealer.
